Documentary honoring Tulalip elder to be screened at Everett Public Library

EVERETT, WA – Throughout her lifetime, Harriette Shelton Dover took on many different roles, including educator, activist, and elder. She battled against social and political systems and fought to preserve her culture for future generations of Tulalip citizens. Shelton's life and legacy are the focus of a documentary, which draws from archival footage and images to tell Shelton's story.

LJ Mowrer of the Tulalip History Project and the curatorial staff from the Hibulb Cultural Center will present a free screening of the award-winning documentary, "Harriette 'hlahl-tsa' Shelton Dover: Her Life and Legacy" on Tuesday, June 11, at 6 p.m. in the Everett Public Library auditorium at 2702 Hoyt Avenue. The program will include a brief introduction and a question and answer session.

This event is part of Everett Public Library's Hands on History series of local history workshops, which meets on the second Tuesday of every month.
