## Immerse yourself in British folk dance with the Mossyback Morris Men

EVERETT, WA – Join the fun as the Mossybacks dance their own unique version of the Cotswold style of English Morris dance on [Sat., Jan. 28, at 2 p.m.](#) at the Main Library, 2702 Hoyt Ave. This event will feature rousing stick dances, live music and, as always, enthusiastic audience participation.

The [Mossyback Morris Men](#) have been dancing their version of the ancient Morris dance in the Seattle area since 1980. They have performed all around the Pacific Northwest, nationally from the West Coast to the East, and internationally in such faraway places as Vancouver, Victoria, Toronto and Hong Kong.

The history of Morris dancing goes back over 500 years and is referred to by Shakespeare. This colorful folk performance is a celebration and display of dance and music, performed at festivals and holidays to banish the dark of winter, celebrate the warmth of summer and bring in autumn's golden harvest.
